CONSIGNMENT NOTE FOR THE CONVEYANCE OF COMPRESSED GASES.

Clause 5 of the consignment note for the carriage of compressed gases (see form E, page 112, of the Coaching Arrangements Book) has been cancelled, and must be erased by a pen on the forms you have in stock. Future supplies of the form will be printed without this clause.

AVAILABILITY OF RETURN TICKETS FOR DISTANCES UP TO 12 MILES.

The first paragraph of Reg. 4 of the Coaching Arrangements Book has been altered to read as

CALVES, &c., TO N. S. STATIONS.

A notice will be inserted in future issues of the Time Table requiring senders of any horse or animal of a declared value exceeding £500, to give at least forty-eight hours' notice to the Company's Stationmaster, and you must not accept for conveyance any horse or animal of a declared greater value than £500, unless such notice has been given. When you receive such a notice you must advise me by telegram immediately, in order that any special precautions deemed necessary may be taken for the safety of the animal.

SILVER COINS PERFORATED OR OTHERWISE DEFACED.

The authorities of the Bank of England have given notice that pierced or defaced silver coins are not legal tender. The Staff must not accept such coins from the public nor pay them to Bank.

Worn or cracked coins will be accepted provided their original value can be recognised.

CONVEYANCE OF THEATRICAL SCENERY.

BRIDGE OF ALLAN.

Referring to parag. 22,1234 my Circular 727, of the 29th November last, the horse and carriage rates in operation between Stirling and stations in England apply also to and from Bridge of Allan.

PARCELS FOR ARDINGLY OR ARDINGLY COLLEGE.

Parcels for these places must be entered to Ardingly station, and not to Hayward's Heath.

The following alterations will take effect on and from the 1st March next, and where necessary traders and all others concerned must be duly advised.

BRONZE FIGURES.

(a) Bronze Figures have been included along with Statuary in C. T. Regulation 79 and must be charged accordingly in future.

HAMS, SAUSAGES, AND BACON.

(b) The minimum for the conveyance of Hams and Sausages (whether cooked or uncooked), and Bacon at the half rate has been reduced to 14 lbs., no less charge than 6d. O. R. delivery included. Alter C. T. Regulation 81, clauses (d) and (e) accordingly.

(c) Add the words "or Laundry Agencies" to the second portion of C. T. Regulation 82, after

(d) Sample Washing Machines on Wheels accompanying a Commercial Traveller must be charged same as a Hawker's Hand Cart under clause c) of C T. Regulation 87, and these articles have been included in Note (ii.) of C. T. Regulation 46.

MOTOR CARS.

(e) Where it is practicable to load two Motor Cars on the same truck, 50 per cent. over the rate for one must be charged, S. to S., maximum weight per truck 50 cwts., minimum charge 10s. 6d. at O. R., 25 per cent. additional at C. R.

LIVE PHEASANTS.

(f) Live Pheasants in truck loads must be charged at the rate of 6d. per truck per mile S. to S. O. R. minimum 7s. 6d. (unless the ordinary parcels rate be less).

LIVE PIGEONS AND LIVE POULTRY TO SHOWS.

(g) Live Pigeons and Live Poultry to Shows must be charged each package separately.

CYCLES WITH WATCHES ATTACHED.

(h) Cycles with Watches attached must not be accepted for conveyance. Passengers accompanying the Cycles must be requested to detach the Watches.

CINEMATOGRAPH FILMS.

(i) Cinematograph Films, packed in tins, when insured must be charged at the class 1 rate of

HORSES SENT TO REPOSITORIES FOR SALE.

(k) Horses sent to Repositories for Sale in lots of twelve or more must be charged the ordinary horse rate, unless the horses belong to a recognised dealer, in which case the dealers' rate must be charged.

MOTOR CARS RETURNING FROM EXHIBITION.

(1) Motor Cars returning from Exhibition, if unsold and remaining the property of the Exhibitor, must be charged at the half rate at O. R., minimum charge, 3s. 9d. Full rates at C. R.

TYPE-WRITING MACHINES.

(m) Type-writing Machines have been included with Sewing Machines in note (ii.) C.T. Regulation 87, and also in note (ii.) of C.T. Regulation 46, and must be charged accordingly.

TAILORS' UNFINISHED AND FINISHED CLOTHING.

(n) Tailors' unfinished and finished Clothing must be charged the same rates as woollen goods and ready-made clothing, viz., half parcels rates, minimum 28 lbs. O. R.; no less charge than 6d.

LIVE MICE.

(o) Live Mice must be charged the full ordinary parcels rates.

FRESH FLOWERS MADE UP INTO WREATHS AND CROSSES.

(p) Fresh Flowers made up into Wreaths and Crosses must be charged ordinary parcels rates.

WOOD BLOCKS AND ELECTROS.

Wood Blocks and Electros when insured must be charged at class 1 rate of insurance.

CAMELS.

(r) Camels when sent by passenger train must be conveyed in horse-boxes, and charged at the horse rate, according to the number of stalls occupied.

BULBS.

(s) Bulbs in small parcels, conveyed at the half parcels rate, will include collection as well as delivery, same as garden and agricultural seeds.

MALT EXTRACT OR GLUCOSE MALTINE.

(t) Malt Extract or Glucose Maltine (a similar preparation to Bovril, Vivo, &c.) must be charged the same rate as Bovril, as per C. T. Reg. 81.

DRUM AND FLUTE CONTESTS.

Members of drum and flute bands attending drum and flute band contests must be conveyed on the same terms as members of brass bands attending brass band contests, as per clauses (b) and (d) of C. T. Reg. 22.

ISSUE OF CHEAP TICKETS TO SOLDIERS ON FURLOUGH.

The instructions contained in clause (a) of C. T. Reg. 141, apply also to sergeant-instructors of yeomanry corps on furlough. The following paragraph must be added to that clause:—"This concession of single fares is not intended to apply to short leave, i.e., for periods of less than a week." The words "sergeant-instructors" must be struck out of note (ii.) clause (c) of that Regulation.

LEICESTER PARCELS HAMPERS.

These Hampers are not in many cases returned to Leicester as quickly as they ought to be; it is of the utmost importance that the empties should be returned without delay, and steps must be taken to ensure this.

OPENING OF NEW STATIONS, ALTERATIONS IN THE NAMES OF STATIONS, &c.
